Based on facts, this docudrama illustrates the threat posed by vulnerable nuclear weapons and materials around the world. The film is followed by a conversation with Tom Brokaw, former Senator Sam Nunn (D-GA) and Senator Richard Lugar (R-IN).

Military families speak out against the war in Iraq. Cindy Sheehan at the Berkeley Fellowship of Unitarians/Universalists. Berkeley, OffCenter Video, 2004 21min. DVD

Antiwar activist Cindy Sheehan speaks about the impact and costs of the War in Iraq to a group in Berkeley. Interjected with photos of her son Casey and other US soldiers who lost their lives in Iraq.

A filmmaker's journey to Hiroshima, sixty years after the bomb. The film features ten hibakusha or atomic bomb survivors. The oldest was a 25 year old newlywed and the youngest weren't born yet when the atomic bomb was dropped on August 6, 1945.

Also on the same disc, **Life was good (1995 27min.)**, also by Steven Okazaki. It's a story about Claudia Petersen's transformation from Mormon housewife in southern Utah into political activist as she realizes that her family's health and happiness is threatened by US government's nuclear testing program in Nevada.

Powerful documentary about conflicting values and the urgency of ensuring universal right to health care. Filmed in Cuba, South Africa, Gambia, Honduras and Venezuela. Examines the case of Cuba which has 28,000 health professionals serving 68 countries.
